WAKATOBI (3d/2n) : Explore World Marine Heritage

Day 1: Matahora Airport - Wangi Wangi - Bajo Mola - Wasabi Nua (-/L/D)

Arrive into Matahora Airport then meet with our guide and driver for lunch at local restaurant serving freshly grilled seafood. Afterward visit to Bajo Mola, a home to the seafaring Bajo people who first settled in Wangi-Wangi in 1958. As descendants of sea nomads, the people of Mola have passed down their culture from generation to generation, including their skills and knowledge on how to live at sea by reading the stars to guide their direction. In here you can also try the Bajo people traditional snacks and see their daily activities. From here we will then go to Wasabi Nua to enjoy sunset also for dinner then in the evening drop back to hotel. Free program.

Day 2: Underwater Trip (B/L/D)

After breakfast meet with guide then depart to the seaport for underwater trip. Wakatobi as UNESCO Marine Biosphere Reserve is the home for over 800 different species of corals and fishes from small colorful fish such as clown fish to big one such as blacktip reef shark therefore Wakatobi is one of the best place for diving or snorkeling. We will visit couple of spots depends on the weather and current condition and also your preferences. In the afternoon going to island but before going to hotel we will visit one of freshwater underwater cave. Later dinner at the hotel and free program.

Day 3: Dolphins Seafaris - Matahora Airport (B/-/-)

Before dawn meeting with guide to catch short boat trip to near Kapota island to see group of dolphins. Here, you can see the beautiful symbiosis between fishermen and the dolphins. In search of tuna, the fishing boats often follow a group of dolphins that know best where to find the best catch. Once they find a school, the hunt begins and the boats and dolphins together encircle the tuna. While the fishermen snatch up the larger fish, the dolphins go for the smaller ones. This is the reason many Bajo consider the dolphins their best friends and would never hurt them. Afterward go back to hotel for breakfast and check out then transfer to airport to catch your outbound flight.

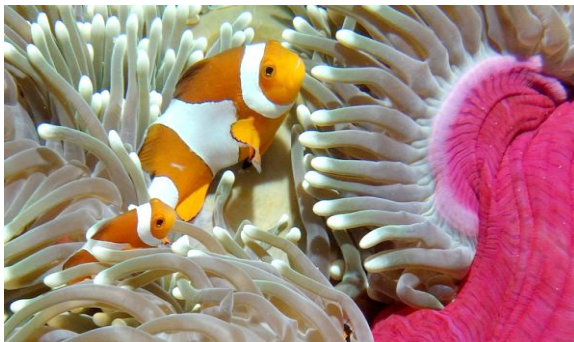
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Day 3: Dolphins Seafaris - Underwater Trip (B/L/D)

Before dawn meeting with guide to catch short boat trip to near Kapota island to see group of dolphins. Here, you can see the beautiful symbiosis between fishermen and the dolphins. In search of tuna, the fishing boats often follow a group of dolphins that know best where to find the best catch. Once they find a school, the hunt begins and the boats and dolphins together encircle the tuna. While the fishermen snatch up the larger fish, the dolphins go for the smaller ones. This is the reason many Bajo consider the dolphins their best friends and would never hurt them. Afterward go back to hotel for breakfast, then later meet with guide again for another diving or snorkeling exploring other site in Wangi Wangi. In the afternoon back to hotel, dinner then free program.

Morning relaxation and breakfast. After check out then drop to airport to catch your outbound flight.



WAKATOBI (6d/5n) : Wangi Wangi and Tomia

Day 1: Matahora Airport - Wangi Wangi - Bajo Mola - Wasabi Nua (-/L/D)

Day 3: Wangi Wangi - Tomia - Patua Fort (B/L/D)

After early breakfast checkout then depart to seaport to catch morning ferry to Tomia. Arrive in Tomia we will visit the local market to enjoy traditional cuisine as lunch. Afterward, we will visit Patua Fort which is the biggest heritage site in Wakatobi. The foundations of the old fort still remain intact. There are 3 main gates to enter the fort and upon entering you will find old graves, ruins of an old mosque, tunnels, old cannons and a big gazebo. Next, check in to accommodation for dinner then free program whilst enjoying the beautiful Tomia night sky.



Day 4: Underwater Trip (B/L/D)

After breakfast meet with guide and then head to pier to start the underwater trip. Around Tomia island there are more than 40 sites enriched by the presence of schooling yellowtail, grouper, sweetlips, red-tooth triggerfish, snapper and number of ornamental fish including damselfish, butterfly fish and rabbit fish, as well as turtles and many more. On other site such as in Wreck of Kulati you can find wreck of Japanese ship that become a home for corals including sponges, table corals, soft corals, anemones and a diverse range of massive hard corals. You will also see a variety of reef fish, schooling batfish, blue streak fusilier, yellow tile fusilier, black tile snapper, rabbit fish, a number of groupers, parrotfish and various ornamental fish such as damselfish, butterfly fish, angelfish and emperor fish. Day 5: Kulati Village - Nda'a Island (B/L/D)

After breakfast depart to Kulati Village to cross to Nda'a which is an uninhabited island with white-sand and clear turquoise water. In here you can go for a swim, snorkel or just enjoying the sun in privacy. Later in the afternoon go back to Kulati Village to visit the local weaving community as well as visit to the bamboo handicraft. Then early dinner at the local restaurant afterward drop back to accommodation and free program.

Day 6: Tomia - Wangi Wangi - Matahora Airport (B/-/-)

Early breakfast then check out then go back to Wangi Wangi after arrival transfer to the airport to catch your outbound flight.





WAKATOBI (10d/9n) : Complete!

Day 1: Matahora Airport - Wangi Wangi - Bajo Mola - Wasabi Nua (-/L/D)

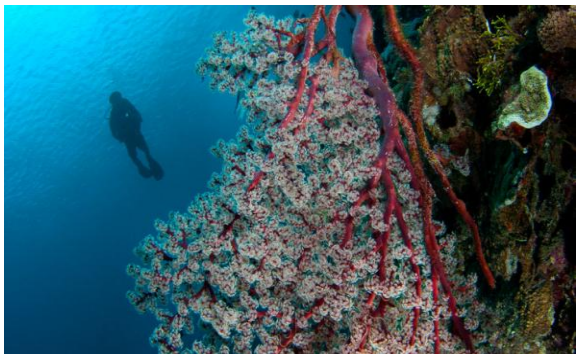
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Day 3: Wangi Wangi - Binongko - Topa Mata - Palahidu Beach (B/L/D)

After early breakfast checkout then depart to seaport to catch morning ferry to Binongko. This island might be the last abbreviation in the name of Wakatobi but it certainly does not lag behind the other islands when it comes to natural and cultural beauty. It is a truly unspoiled land, full of rocky hills and dramatic cliffs, with inviting beaches, turtle breeding grounds and countless springs hidden throughout. The trip will takes around 5 – 6 hours then transfer to your local accommodation. Then we will go to Topa Mata to see one of world biggest species flying fox that live in colony above the trees. Afterward, we will go to Palahidu beach for the extraordinary sunset. Dinner at local restaurant then free program.



Day 4: Bante - Topa La Bago - Popalia Village (B/L/D)

After breakfast we will explore Bante that located on the coast of Binongko. Just before entering the village there is a rocky entrance to the ocean. It is rather difficult to pass, and requires a short climb down the rocks, but if you make the effort, a heart-stealing snorkeling spot awaits you. Swimming out above the reef you will see a huge coral fan garden just below you. You can relaxing by the beach or continue snorkelling and after lunch we will jump from the cliff in the ancient fresh water spring. After enjoying afternoon snack we will visit the well known blacksmith in all part of Wakatobi. The locals here have been making machetes for generation. In the evening, visit to the night market for dinner then free program.

Day 5: Binongko - Tomia - Patua Fort (B/L/D)

Early breakfast then check out to the pier for boat ride to Tomia. Arrive in Tomia we will visit the local market to enjoy traditional cuisine as lunch. Afterward, we will visit Patua Fort which is the biggest heritage site in Wakatobi. The foundations of the old fort still remain intact. There are 3 main gates to enter the fort and upon entering you will find old graves, ruins of an old mosque, tunnels, old cannons and a big gazebo. Next, check in to accommodation for dinner then free program whilst enjoying the beautiful Tomia night sky.

Day 6: Underwater Trip (B/L/D)

After breakfast meet with guide and then head to pier to start the underwater trip. Day 8: Tomia - Kaledupa - Hoga (B/L/D)

Early departure from Tomia to Kaledupa where upon arrival catch another boat ride to Hoga, a small island located roughly 15 minutes by boat from Kaledupa. It has become popular among researchers as this island is blessed with white sand beaches, shady coconut groves and a beautiful reef perfect for extended snorkelling and diving sessions. There are no roads or vehicles on the island, just one very small village on the northern end. Arrive at waterfront resort then free program.

Day 9: Bajo Sampela Village - Kaledupa - Limbo Langge - Pajam Village - Hoga (B/L/D)

In the morning head to Bajo Ssamepla Village, a traditional Bajo village that rises out of the ocean. Several thousand inhabitants live in traditional wooden stilt houses, which are built on a coral stone base. These impressive constructions are built in rows connected by narrow bamboo bridges under which small boats pass. Children welcome visitors to their village with broad smiles. Afterward depart to Kaledua to visit Limbo Langge, a traditional area in eastern Kaledupa that consists of eight villages whose boundaries were decided long ago under the local law. Heading to mangrove forest to explore this lush habitat by using small canoe we can see some of Indonesia endemic birds nesting here. Next, visit to traditional village, Pajam where the locals here are also famous for hand-weaving fabric and craft. We will participate in cooking class that will be serve for our lunch. Then accompanied by a beautiful sunset we will head back to Hoga Island to end the day with a delicious dinner on the beach.

Day 10: Kaledupa - Wangi Wangi (B/-/-)

Early check out then transfer from Hoga to Kaledupa which then another boat trip to Wangi Wangi. Arrive in Wangi Wangi transfer by car to airport to catch your outbound flight.
